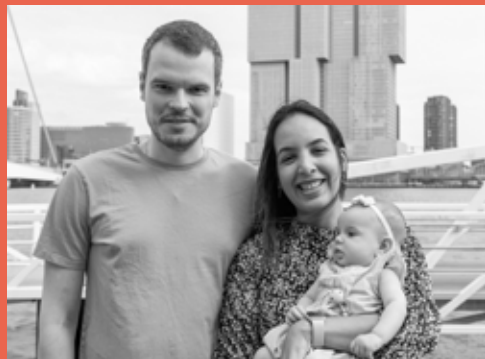
Gerjan

One of the things we do as a church are the street teams. It is part of social justice. We reach out to people in Amsterdam West once a month. In the end we prayed together and he gave his life to God! Now we come back regularly to talk more, read the bible together and pray and help him with his garden. God is good!

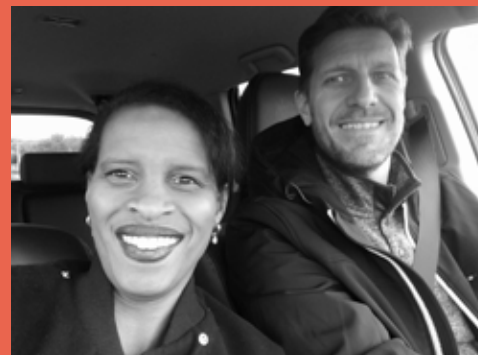

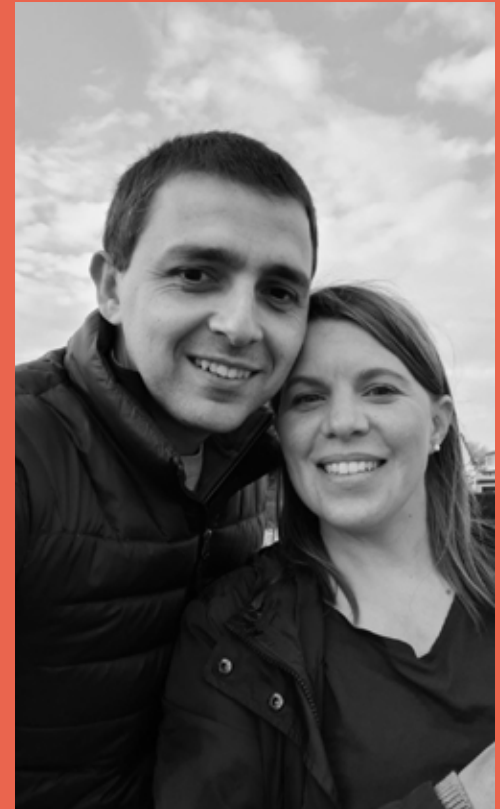

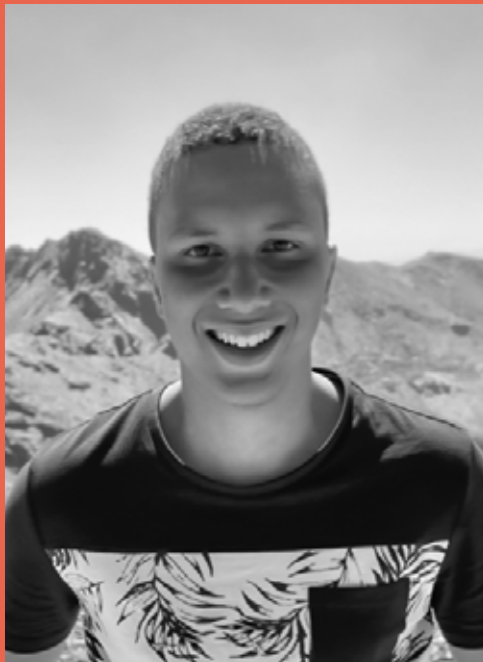

Improvements to Theater Amsterdam

Part of this year's Heart for the House offering will go towards improving our Amsterdam campus. Theater Amsterdam has been a great church home for us over the last few years, but our AV system needs an overhaul requiring a significant investment. For parents with babies we also want to make sure that they have a great Sunday experience in the parents room, moving and improving it.



Move into Van Nelle Fabriek

We are in the process of moving into a larger building for our Rotterdam campus, to make room for the days ahead and welcome more people into His House. Part of Heart for the House offering will go towards setting up the Van Nelle Fabriek.

Live worship in Brussels

We are improving the church experience by providing full live worship in our Brussels campus. The team has grown in number and in skill and part of this Hear for the House offering will go towards the equipment to facilitate this.



Broadcasting Dutch service

In the last season we have started Dutch services to reach more people with the Good News. Part of this year's miracle offering will go towards AV equipment that will allow us to broadcast the live Dutch service from Theater Amsterdam into several cities in the Netherlands.
